- Read: 1 Corinthians 6:1-11
 - What are Paul's concerns regarding believers taking their civil cases before outside judges?
 - Based on this chapter, how would you finish the initial phrase of 1 Corinthians 6:1: "If any of you has a dispute against another..."?
 - Paul speaks of Christ's work in Christians as an ongoing work and a finished one. How are both true?
 - How does Paul seek to radically reshape what a Christian values most in civil matters?
 - In what was can it be good for the church to remember that the watching world is seeing how we handle church conduct?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- How can your church structures (Pastors, members, small groups...) help handle disagreements and civil issues?
- Why is it important to remember who you were before accepting Christ?
- How can your past identity propel you toward holiness without serving as a continual source of shame?
- Why would Paul's language of "brother" and "sister" remind the Corinthians that part of their issue stems from how they view one another?
