

Begin: take this time to hear how everyone is doing, and get settled in.

- What is something to celebrate this week?
- IceBreaker: Are you good at learning from others mistakes or do you need to be able to make your own mistakes?
  - How does learning from others save you from pain?

<u>Listen</u>: This is for reflection on Sunday's Sermon and thoughts from the message.

- What stood out to you about this week's message?
- Is there anything you still are thinking about or have questions about?

<u>Discover</u>: Take time to dig deeper into the passage/topic for this week.

- Read: 1 Corinthians 10:1-22
  - How does God's example from the Old Testament of guidance, deliverance, provision, and/or wrath, serve as an example for us today?
  - How does the Old Testament compare to the New Testament teaching of punishment? What are some similarities and differences?
  - Sin has such severe consequences, so why do we choose to sin? How can we better remember the consequences of sin to guard ourselves from believing its lies?
  - Does not being tempted "beyond what one is able" (vs 13) have to do with someone's personal strength or God's ability to help?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- How can learning from the Old and New Testament help you learn from mistakes made, and also faithful obedience?
- How can confessing temptations help Christians to support one another and avoid falling into sin?
- Are you ever surprised that you must regularly fight temptations to sin?
- How can verse 13 encourage you as you bear temptations until Jesus returns?
