- According to 5:11–12, what problem does the author identify in his audience?
- How are "milk" and "solid food" used as metaphors in 5:12–14?
- What are the "elementary teachings" listed in 6:1–2?
- What warning is given in 6:4–6, and what makes it so serious?
- How does the tone shift in 6:9–12, and what encouragement is offered to believers?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- here do you see signs of spiritual maturity—or immaturity—in your own life?
- What habits or patterns tend to keep people spiritually stagnant?
- How can you move from just “knowing” truth to actually living it out?
- This passage contains a strong warning—how should that shape your view of your faith?
- What is one specific step you can take this week to grow toward maturity in Christ?

- MY ONE THING — What is your 1 takeaway from this study, and how will it impact your upcoming week?

Pray: Feel free to pray in a way that best fits your group. Take time each week to pray with and for each other.
