- What is Paul’s own view of “unclean” food?
- Concerning Christian hospitality, why should we remember that Christ has welcomed both those weak in faith and those strong in faith?
- Regarding relationships in the church, why must we remember the way of Christ, that he “did not please himself” (15:3)?
- Why should we see earthly squabbles in light of God’s global purposes of salvation?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- How should we walk alongside those with differences when it is just differences of opinion?
 - How do we tear down others just in our quarrels over opinions/ and self convictions?
 - How might we better hold onto Romans 14:19 as a core verse in our lives?
 - How might we find encouragement in Scripture? (15:4)
 - How can we better promote Unity within our Life Group? Church? Community?
