



Begin: take this time to hear how everyone is doing, and get settled in.

- What is something to celebrate this week?
 - IceBreaker: Describe a time when you completed a task that never had to be done again. What made it feel so satisfying to know it was finished?
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Listen: This is for reflection on Sunday's Sermon and thoughts from the message.

- What stood out to you about this week's message?
 - Is there anything you are still thinking about or have questions about?
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Discover: Take time to dig deeper into the passage/topic for this week.

• **Read: Hebrews 9:15-28**

- According to verses 15–17, why was Jesus' death necessary for the new covenant to take effect?
- What examples from the Old Testament does the author use in verses 18–22 to explain the seriousness of sin and the necessity of blood for forgiveness?
- How does Jesus' entrance into heaven (verses 23–24) differ from the ministry of the earthly priests?
- According to verses 25–26, why is it significant that Christ offered Himself once for all instead of repeatedly?
- Vs 27–28 compare the certainty of death and judgment with the certainty of Christ's return. What hope is given to those who are waiting for Him?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- Why do you think it's difficult for people to fully believe that Jesus' sacrifice was completely sufficient?
- How can guilt or shame tempt us to act as though we still have to earn God's forgiveness?
- What does it look like to live each day with confidence that your sins have already been fully paid for?
- If Christ's work is finished and your future is secure in Him, how should that shape your priorities and decisions this week?
- **MY ONE THING** — What is your 1 takeaway from this study, and how will it impact your upcoming week?

Pray: Feel free to pray in a way that best fits your group. Take time each week to pray with and for each other.
