



Begin: take this time to hear how everyone is doing, and get settled in.

- What is something to celebrate this week?
 - IceBreaker: If a world leader were coming to your town, what would you expect the arrival to look like? (Motorcade, Security, Flashy Entrance, Power Display?)
 - When Jesus Enters Jerusalem as King... how was it not what was expected?
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Listen: This is for reflection on Sunday's Sermon and thoughts from the message.

- What stood out to you about this week's message?
 - Is there anything you are still thinking about or have questions about?
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Discover: Take time to dig deeper into the passage/topic for this week.

• **Read: Mark 11:1-11**

- In verses 1–3, what details show that Jesus is intentionally orchestrating this moment? What does this reveal about His authority?
- Why is the colt significant? (See Zechariah 9:9 background.) What kind of king rides a young donkey?
- What actions do the crowd take in verses 7–8? What do those actions communicate about how they view Jesus?
- In verses 9–10, what exactly are they shouting? What does "Hosanna" mean? What kingdom are they expecting?
- What is surprising about verse 11? After all the excitement, what does Jesus do?
- Based only on this passage, how would you describe the type of kingship Jesus is revealing?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- Jesus enters humbly, not forcefully. How does His humility challenge your view of leadership and influence?
- What kind of king do you naturally want Jesus to be in your life — A fixer? A provider? A political ruler? A comforter? How does that compare to who He reveals Himself to be?
- Is there an area of your life where you welcome Jesus with praise but resist His authority?
- Jesus inspected the temple quietly in verse 11. If He examined your heart this week, what would He find?
- Palm branches are easy. The cross is costly. What would it look like for you to remain faithful when following Jesus becomes inconvenient or unpopular?
- MY ONE THING — What is your 1 takeaway from this study, and how will it impact your upcoming week?
