



Begin: take this time to hear how everyone is doing, and get settled in.

- What is something to celebrate this week?
 - **IceBreaker:** Think of a time you met someone truly impressive - a leader, a hero, someone way out of your league. How did it make you see yourself differently?
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Listen: This is for reflection on Sunday's Sermon and thoughts from the message.

- What stood out to you about this week's message?
 - Is there anything you are still thinking about or have questions about?
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Discover: Take time to dig deeper into the passage/topic for this week.

• **Read: Isaiah 6:1-8**

- Isaiah sees the Lord "high and lifted up," with seraphim crying "Holy, holy, holy." What does this vision reveal about who God is?
- Isaiah's first response is "Woe is me... I am a man of unclean lips." Why does seeing God clearly lead Isaiah to see himself clearly?
- A seraphim touches Isaiah's mouth with a coal and says his guilt is taken away. What does this act show about how forgiveness happens — earned or given?
- God asks, "Whom shall I send?" after Isaiah is cleansed, not before. What does that order teach us about the relationship between grace and calling?
- Isaiah's answer is immediate: "Here am I, send me." What changed in him between verse 5 and verse 8?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- Where do you need a clearer picture of who God is right now — bigger, holier, closer than you've been treating Him?
- Isaiah's honesty about his own sin came right after his clearest view of God. Does your view of God make you more honest about yourself, or more likely to hide?
- What "unclean lips" moment — habit, mindset, wound — do you need God to touch and cleanse?
- Isaiah didn't clean himself up before God called him. Where are you waiting to feel "ready" before saying yes to something God's put in front of you?
- **MY ONE THING** — What is your 1 takeaway from this study, and how will it impact your upcoming week?

Pray: Feel free to pray in a way that best fits your group. Take time each week to pray with and for each other.

Notes: Space for you notes from your time together.
