- What details are given about Melchizedek in verses 1–3, and why are they significant?
- How does Abraham's interaction with Melchizedek (v.4–10) demonstrate Melchizedek's greatness?
- According to verses 11–19, why was a new priesthood necessary?
- What role does God's oath play in establishing Jesus as priest (v.20–22)?
- What makes Jesus' priesthood superior according to verses 23–28?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- What does it mean to you personally that Jesus “always lives to intercede” for you?
  - Where do people tend to look for mediation or help besides Christ?
  - How does Jesus’ ability to “save completely” affect your view of salvation?
  - Do you live as though Jesus’ work is fully sufficient—or do you try to add to it?
  - What would it look like this week to rely more fully on Jesus as your mediator?
