



Begin: take this time to hear how everyone is doing, and get settled in.

- What is something to celebrate this week?
 - **IceBreaker:** What is a meal or celebration that meant more to you than just the food? A moment of real joy or relief? What made it feel that way?
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Listen: This is for reflection on Sunday's Sermon and thoughts from the message.

- What stood out to you about this week's message?
 - Is there anything you are still thinking about or have questions about?
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Discover: Take time to dig deeper into the passage/topic for this week.

• **Read: Isaiah 24:1-6 and Isaiah 25:6-9**

- Isaiah 24 describes the earth broken, mourning, and laid waste because people have "transgressed the laws, violated the statutes, broken the everlasting covenant" (v.5). What does this connection between judgment and broken covenant reveal about how seriously God takes His word?
- After a chapter of devastation, 25:1 opens with praise: "O LORD, you are my God... you have done wonderful things." What does it mean that worship can rise up on the other side of judgment, not just before it?
- Isaiah 25:6 says the Lord will prepare a feast "for all peoples," not just Israel. What does the scope of this invitation reveal about the reach of God's plan?
- Verse 8 promises God will "swallow up death forever" and wipe away every tear. Why does the feast image fit as the picture for this promise, rather than just relief or rescue?

Apply: Take time to apply these Biblical Truths to your life.

- Isaiah 24 shows that sin has real consequences, even on a broken world we live in every day. Where do you see evidence of that brokenness around you, and how does it shape the way you long for what's coming?
- The feast in 25:6 is for "all peoples" — a strikingly wide invitation. Is there anyone you've quietly written off as outside God's reach?
- Verse 7 pictures a veil being lifted off the nations. What "veil" — distraction, doubt, distortion — has kept you from seeing God clearly?
- God promises to wipe away every tear (25:8). What tears are you currently carrying that you need to bring to Him rather than manage on your own?
- **MY ONE THING** — What is your 1 takeaway from this study, and how will it impact your upcoming week?

Pray: Feel free to pray in a way that best fits your group. Take time each week to pray with and for each other.

Notes: Space for you notes from your time together.
